MAYOR'S CHAT BOX:

It is hard to believe the day will soon be here when I will no longer be having these semiannual chats with all of you through the borough newsletters. I will be retiring from the office of Mayor at the end of this year. It is an office that I held for 8 years, preceded by 5 years as borough secretary-treasurer. I enjoyed writing these articles for the newsletter over the years and I hope that you received some enjoyment when reading them.

Jacobus is a small, quaint and quiet town. Some people in this town have lived here all of their life and some have just recently moved into the area. All the residents worked hard to pay mortgages or rent and raise their children to enjoy the peace and quiet that goes with a small town. So lets work together to keep it that way. I want to thank all of you for making Jacobus this great place to live and work and for giving me the opportunity to serve the community during my tenure as Mayor. I urge you to continue to support the next mayor, the borough council and the various volunteer civic organizations so the community may continue to prosper.

Now for a few "food for thought" remarks for the coming Fall and Winter months:

- 1. Trick or Treat night in the borough will be held on Saturday, October 31st, 2009 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. If you are welcoming "Trick or Treaters" to your home for this event, please turn your porch light on for them. Children should wear light colored or reflective clothing for safety purposes.
- 2. When the snows come this winter remember that whenever approximately 2" or more occur, snowplowing will begin in the borough and a snow emergency declaration may be enacted. (Tune in to the following TV and radio stations for the snow emergency declarations, local closings, delays and cancellations—WGAL8; Fox 43; ABC 27; WSBA 910 or WGTY 107.7) Also remember that all vehicles must be removed from the borough streets to allow for snowplows to do the job efficiently and safely. Also all residents are responsible for removing snow and ice from their sidewalks and PLEASE DO NOT throw snow from your property into the street.
- 3. The census is coming to town early in year 2010. The purpose of the census is to correctly gather information about our community and the United States as a whole. In recent years many federal, state and local government plans, grants and revenue sharing have been based by law on factors calculated from census statistics. Personal census information is confidential and any breach of confidentiality could result in fines or prison terms for those persons responsible.
- 4. In conclusion I would like to wish the residents of Jacobus a safe and fun-filled Fall, Winter and Holiday Season.

A grant has been received by Jacobus Borough to make improvements to 'The Woods at Lake Redman' Nature area. Volunteers are needed to assist in the planning & completion of upgrades to the Nature area. Jacobus Borough has seen a **Spike in Crime** over the past several months. During the 3rd Quarter, Borough Council approved an increase in police patrols for the remainder of 2009. Serious consideration is being given to include a permanent increase in police patrols in preparation of the 2010 budget. Once Jacobus Borough's 2010 Budget is approved, the cost for Police Protection is expected to exceed \$65,000.00 p/year.

Borough Council would encourage all residents to make sure vehicle doors are locked at all times, as well as keeping homes & outbuildings secured at all times. Please do not hesitate to call 911 if you see any suspicious activity in your neighborhood.

L. T. Godfrey was the successful bidder to provide **winter road maintenance** for Jacobus Borough during the 2009-2010 season.

Winter maintenance during an average year costs between \$12,000.00 to \$18,000.00. The expense for a typical storm involving sleet, ice & a few inches of snow is approximately \$6,000.00.

Residents of Jacobus Borough are requested to please mark the grass & curb line of their property to prevent damage. Street right-of-ways do extend into private property.

As many of you are aware the U.S. Postal Service has announced the **possible** closing of the Jacobus Branch of the York Post Office and moving all services to the East York Branch. The final decision on closing the Jacobus Branch will be made later this fall.

While the Loganville Post Office is within 4 miles of Jacobus, you will still have to travel 22 miles round trip taking an additional 1 1/2 hours of your time to do business at the East York Post Office, such as pick-up packages or certified mail, and other special business.

In addition to the external expansion, the inside was modified to meet the growing needs of the ambulance crew. New secure office space and upgraded crew ready rooms were provided. Updated equipment was also procured that included computer and training aids. Pictured is a view of the external expansion and the ready room that includes a secure mailbox system. Additional rest rooms were provided to meet the needs of men and women crewmembers and the main training room was also expanded.


